

Loch around the Clock WE SIZE UP THE CRAPARREST-O-THON OF THE YEAR AT FASLANE 365

Even in far Northern Britain, anti-nuclear action is a world wide affair, as demonstrated by the arrests of 23 Swedes and 19 Finns who made up the bulk of the 42 people nicked at last Monday's Faslane 365 demo (see SchNEWS 562) at the nuclear weapons base in Scotland.

Despite all the heavy-handedness, cops would probably have felt a bit more chuffed about nicking almost two thirds of the total number of demonstrators there, were it not for the fact they'd spent so long trying to clear access to the base. It would appear that the same nation that wowed the world with sturdy cars and well-made furniture also makes top grade tubes for lock-ons! Cops spent two and a half hours cutting people away from the north gate whilst the tripod lock-on made a welcome return and police struggled to reopen the south gate for more than three hours.

Protesters were nicked for breach of the peace, held for more than 30 hours and then

released with a warning letter. Things got a bit tighter for one protester as he found himself nicked for attempting to pervert the course of justice when he nipped off for a pee in a nearby wood. Unfortunately for our bustin' hero, police wouldn't let him finish what he'd started and he had to cross his legs for another three hours!

The action was part of the Faslane 365 campaign - a year long 'relay blockade' of the nuclear base on the river Clyde. As UK plc prepares to splash out another £76 billion building new bombs, its own breach of the Non-Proliferation Treaty risks pushing the world into another potentially deadly arms race. Between now and Christmas loads of different groups have planned dozens of actions that are sure to keep cops busy and the bomb builders out of their place of work.

The first few days of action saw a 90strong Women in Black blockade. A couple of days later the baton was passed to activists from Sheffield and North Derbyshire who did a little bit of locking on themselves, with another 12 arrestees being given sternly written letters warning them off doing any blockading in future. On Sunday, a physician was arrested as he joined members of the Assynt Peace Group from Sutherland in another demo, and the next day a Welsh grandmother was nicked for chaining herself to the north gate causing a three-mile traffic jam.

So far protesters are just getting written reminders from cops about how naughty they've been, but how long this 'leniency' will last in the face of such determined protests remains to be seen. ## **AND THE PEAT GOES ON** SchNEWS gets its hands dirty and fingers burnt in the climate change debate

So what on *earth* do bogs, moors, muskegs, mires and tropical swamp forests all have in common? Yep, the clue was in the question they're made of good old peat that's what. The rich soily stuff forms from layers of decayed organic matter. Under the right conditions it is an early stage of the coal forming process. And all that means that it's packed full of carbon, which as nearly everyone (!) now knows causes major hassles for the climate when it gets rudely and massively released at the hands of unthinking humans. You might be surprised to learn that the carbon stored in global peat is the equivalent of 100 years of fossil fuel emissions at current rates.

If you're thinking of boggy Ireland and the swampy Florida Everglades as typical examples of peatlands, and guessing that there must be loads of inaccessible places where the peat is left largely undisturbed, you'd be right. Only 7% of the world's peatland has been exploited and yet the effects of it have already caused measurable problems for the environment.

So how does the world's peat every get its carbon released? Well, for example over 60% of the world's tropical peat is in one place: Indonesia. There, and across South-East Asia, huge greenhouse gas emissions are caused annually as forests and peatlands are deliberately torched, largely to make way for enormous oil palm plantations and acacia plantations. These produce palm oil, timber and paper, plenty of which heads straight for the European market. The destruction has accelerated recently because Europe has started importing vast amounts of palm oil for biodiesel and also for biomass to burn in power stations.

And quite aside from the environmental concerns, all this resource explotation has also lead to the usual capitalist vices: local farmers are evicted and forced into barely arable natural areas, there are massive human rights abuses and an estimated 30% of children under five in the peatland areas suffer from respiratory diseases and associated growth retardation because of the fires.

Overall this flaming mess is responsible for carbon emissions of a not-so-cool 1 billion tonnes a year – a heavyweight contributor when you consider that the Kyoto Protocol only aims to reduce total global emissions by around 188 million tonnes per year from 1990 levels. This underlines just how woeful a response to climate change the global governance game has come up with. The emissions they encourage and allow in Indonesia alone would take several Kyoto's to negate. And the real irony is that the industries responsible for all the destruction are getting large amounts of their funding

through the crazy carbon credit competition bonanza (See SchNEWS 311), the so-called 'Clean Development Mechanism' transfers under that same Kyoto Protocol.

One report claims that the 1997 emissions from Indonesia may well have exceeded total emissions from any other country, including the US. Gee, that's some real great pollutin there, especially when you remember that California is the world's 4th largest total polluter on its own. And as South East Asia continues to burn and slash, with others like Malaysia and Brunei joining the party, the climate is doubly threatened as not only does peat destruction release massive quantities of carbon, it also destroys one of the planet's most important carbon sinks, meaning less other CO2 emissions can be absorbed by the biosphere.

This all means that peat should be the word on everyone's lips - but over here more people are concerned about the latest crises in the world of Pete and Moss. While receiving little press, the situation is now so alarming to informed climate campaigners that they have organised into new groups to try and raise awareness - and do what their governments are failing to do for all humanities sake. One of these is the new Biofuelwatch, which is distributing an urgent action alert at www.climateark.org as well as a campaign to stop Npower from profiting from cleverly fulfilling their mandated 'Renewables Obligation' by just burning palm oil from Indonesian and Malaysian deforestation.

\* Queens Market, in Upton Park - London's most multi-ethnic market - is threatened with destruction as part of 'renewals' for the 2012 London Olympics - which include building 240 executive apartments on the site. Residents from the borough of Newham are protesting against the loss of the market with a march and samba carnival - all welcome - from Plashet Park along Green St to the market, at 11am on October 28th. The protest will be directed at St Modwen, the devel-

\* The Stockton Heath Primary School - is a large, listed Edwardian red-brick school in Warrington threatened with replacement by a new concrete job knocked up on the cheap - as well as 400 new homes on the land waved through by a dodgy council deal. This is part of the Govt's £17.5 billion 'Building Schools for the Future' programme which aims to 'renew' all secondary schools in the UK over the next 10-15 years - which will see half of current schools demolished in quick-buck PFI projects. #### HOMELAND INSECURITY

The warmongering White House just refuses to be intimidated by international human-rights standards as Puppet No.1, G.W. Bush, signs into law the Military Commissions Act. Back in June, the Supreme Court ruled that the military tribunals set up to prosecute detainees at Guantanamo Bay violated both US and international law. The tribunals avoided inconveniences like habeas corpus (the right of a detainee to challenge their detention) as the Bush Junta sought to extract guilty verdicts whether or not the accused had committed any crime. They reckon the way to get a confession is through a little bit of prison rough and tumble and, Abu Ghraib aside, Amnesty has documented many cases of secret detention, enforced disappearance, torture and other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment.

Referring to the Act as "one of the most important pieces of legislation in the War on Terror<sup>TM</sup>" Dubbya gave himself the right to imprison anyone indefinitely and to determine what constitutes unacceptable interrogation techniques. Meanwhile those US officials who tortured detainees captured before the end of 2005 will be immune from prosecution and US courts will be prohibited from using "foreign or international law" when deciding on the guilt of CIA and Army interrogators who stand accused of using torture.

White House Inc. can't wait to take some revenge for 9/11 ahead of the Congressional and Presidential elections. First up for a lethal injection will be Khalid Sheikh Mohammed, the alleged mastermind of the attacks. The US defence department has another 10 detainees who are ready to be processed by the tribunals and the are preparing to charge about 65 more. No doubt where 'tough interrogation' fails to extract a confession, the tribunals will pick up the slack, ready to deliver a guilty plea on the flimsiest of evidence not even disclosed to the accused beforehand. Bush told an audience gathered for the signing ceremony that the act will show that the US "is patient and decent and fair," - no doubt the thousands of detainees held in secret US prisons will beg to differ.

The Fairford Coach saga moves to the House Of Lords on 23-25th October when the Lords hear the case of the protesters who, on 22nd March 2003, were in coaches bound for RAF Fairford to protest against the beginning of the invasion on Iraq, but were detained by police, searched, and made to return to London. #### Inside SchNEWS

A saboteur working in medical research has become the first to be convicted under new SOCPA laws designed to protect the animal experiments industry from animal rights activists.

Joseph Harris, a cancer research scientist, was given 3 years in a Nottingham court last month for damaging property belonging to three businesses with contracts to Huntington Life Sciences (HLS), the UK's biggest animal experiments laboratory.

Harris, who is a published pancreatic cancer doctor, was disgusted by the pressure his colleagues were putting on him to perform animal experiments. A girlfriend left him when she found out what his job involved. He finally decided to fight back and waged a one-man campaign against firms he knew supplied HLS with vital equipment.
