



A SHOT IN THE ARM FOR BRIC Last Friday, one of the seventeen strong Brighton delegation to Palestine was shot by the Israeli Defence Force. Tom was hit with a rubber bullet (a rubber bullet in IDF terminology is a steel bullet coated in rubber). Fortunately the shot, ricocheting off his arm, was not lethal.

The Brightonians were part of an international presence at the ongoing community-led demonstrations against the Apartheid Wall being built through the West Bank town of Bil'in (see SchNEWS 566, 544). This demo was during Palestinian Prisoner's week, to highlight the plight of thousands of Palestinians held under 'administrative detention', with some activists walking inside a mock cage. As the demo was 200 metres from the wall it was met with a hail of tear-gas followed up with rubber bullets. Although the combination of Palestinian villagers, Israeli anarchists and Cowley Club regulars tried to force the demo through, they were driven back by Israeli army jeeps, who entered the village. In all sixteen protesters were shot and injured by the IDF. A medic from the Palestinian Red Crescent was shot in the stomach, and another local man was shot in the groin. A French activist was shot by a tear gas canister at close range and sustained severe burns.

Tom, after being treated by the Red Crescent ambulance, told SchNEWS. "This violent attack by the Israeli Army on peaceful unarmed demonstrators is unbelievable. The people of this village have had their land stolen, their olive trees uprooted, and their livelihoods devastated. By daring to protest against this injustice they are met with aggression and violence. This has made me more determined than ever to support them, and other people in Palestine, in their struggle for their land, their country, and their freedom."

In the same week fourteen other protesters had been injured by the IDF whilst demonstrating for children's rights. The Israeli army lost no time in showing where their concern for children lays by shooting seven of them. In Bethlehem, a further 10 people were injured in anti wall protests.

KEEPIN' IT ISRAEL

Despite this repression activists still disrupted Israeli plans for settlement expansion and the continued walling in of Palestinian lives. In the face of IDF violence, in Bethlehem protesters succeeded in destroying foundations to the wall and a watchtower and in Bil'in a group of activists succeeded in cutting down 20 metres of an Israeli settlement fence. A video of the action is available at the Anarchists Against the Wall website (www.awalls.org). The Tubas region of the Jordan Valley is almost all entirely controlled by Israel. The region spreads from Tubas town, in the northern hills of the Israeli occupied West Bank, over to the fertile plains of the Jordan Valley. Most of the Tubas locals were farmers, travelling from the town to their land in the Valley, but to get there they need to get past an Army checkpoint which requires Jordan Valley residents' ID – which they don't have – effectively putting a chokehold on their livelihoods. 95% of the land and 98% of the water there has been taken from the Palestinians since 1967 who often have no choice but to work in the Israeli settlements.

In Palestinian villages the people have lost nearly all their land and many have had their houses demolished. With Israeli-imposed restrictions there is very little health care, education is limited, there are no phone lines or public transport, often there is no electricity, and much of the water supply is contaminated by waste from Israeli settlements. All aspects of Palestinian economic life and independence are ruthlessly strangled.

In the Jordan Valley, a major fruit producing region, there are areas where Palestinians are not even allowed new buildings in their villages. In the village of Fayasal the Israelis kicked up a stink amongst the locals when they



put a demolition order on the village's toilets.

The Brighton delegation is looking into building a tent school (the village has been barred from building one out of bricks and mortar). The nearby village of Al Jiflic already has a tent school thanks to local tenacity and the support of internationals, and partly as a result of this Al Jiflic has now obtained permission to build a more permanent school.

Just because the media seem to have been taking a break from reporting on Palestine does not mean that either Palestinians have stopped resisting or that people have stopped taking action there. In fact, in the absence of major Palestinian armed attacks, the place of non-violent resistance is stronger than ever and, as the above examples show, are capable of achieving real results.

There is currently (18-20 April) a conference in Bil'in on non-violence organised by the International Solidarity Movement building on grass roots and global non-violent direct action against Israeli aggression.

DERAIL THE GATWICK EXPRESS

Certain they're just not locking up enough foreign migrants, the Home Office – soon to be split into the far more sinister sounding Justice and Security departments – are planning to build yet another detention centre, this time handily located away from prying eyes, actually inside Gatwick airport's fenced boundaries (See SchNEWS 538).

It's all necessary to keep up the government's racist migration policy of locking up everybody and then dealing with each case once they are safely in detention. So much easier to then stick 'em on a one-way plane outta here, you see.

The whole immigration system is orientated to the removal of migrants, whether they seek asylum or not. Of the 2,966 places currently available in the Immigration Detention Estate, 2,065 are in 'Removal Centres' (privately-run prisons in all but name) with a further 588 places in Removal Prisons (managed by the Prison Service). This means seven out of the current ten immigration detention centres are run by private companies - good reliable firms like the notorious Group4 – a sweet little earner, if you can keep costs to a minimum, of course.

Decent conditions and humane treatment are the first things to suffer in the corporate economy drives - various reports have described the utterly racist regime in place in the detention centres. Detainees are routinely abused and beaten up. Those who dare to complain or protest are quickly transferred to other detention centres or deported. This has even forced inmates into hunger strikes and full-scale rebellions in some of these Gulags, such as last December's riot at Harmondsworth (SchNEWS 571).

The new centre, recently given approval from Crawley City Council, will have places for over 400 more migrants.

IT'S ALL ACADEMIC

Protesters have scored a major victory against Labour school privatisation policies in Brent. The backer of a proposed new City Academy, Andrew Rosenfield, withdrew his bid to sponsor a proposed new Academy on community sports grounds near London's newest over-budget white (city) vanity elephant, Wembley stadium.

In late March, residents, parents and teachers took matters into their own hands by camping out and occupying the site of the proposed academy - Wembley Park Sports Ground, Brent.

With little more than tents and their presence as weapons, they pledged to continue their occupation until the plans for the academy were withdrawn. And just one week after their camp began, the main sponsor withdrew his bid. The social benefactor in question, Andrew Rosenfield, who by sheer coincidence has also bankrolled the Labour Party to the tune of a cool million quid, lives as a tax exile in Geneva and has presumably decided to turn his capital towards somewhat easier profits.

Brent Council have now roped in ARK, a group of hedge fund speculators, to try and salvage the academy proposal. ARK includes the Lib Dems' largest financial contributor, Peter Marshall.

Although it may seem strange for residents and educators to be protesting against the building of a new school, they are not without their reasons. The proposed school will be one of Neo-Labour's flagship academy schools. These new institutions are, in reality, a form of stealth privatisation. Corporate sponsors agree to pay 'up to' £2 million towards the cost of constructing a new school (in reality very little of this money is ever actually paid) in return for seats on the educational board, promises of knighthoods and the agreement of the government to pay for all of the running costs.

A local teacher, Jean Roberts, said "As far as we know this is the first occupation opposing an academy. We've been amazed by the tremendous level of support coming from the local people. We oppose the idea of academies because they are schools being run by a private individual using tax payers' money."

These City Academies (of which the government plan to build more than 400 across the country) are undemocratic institutions. Corporate sponsors (including such child development specialists as Dixons Stores) have the majority on governing boards and can make decisions concerning the schools' 'visions'. This has important implications for the future of British schooling. It's no coincidence that over half of the academies count 'business and enterprise' as their speciality. Less commercially useful subjects like philosophy or history presumably will be pushed to the back of the class.

It won't come as a great surprise that a major reason for politicians' love of academies is the chance to mutually grease a few more oily palms. They can and do sit on the boards of companies that manage them: former education minister Lord Filkin is a director of Serco, which manages schools, and former education secretary Charles Clarke is a non-executive director of LJ Group - now heavily involved in the government's Building Schools for the Future programme.

The Brent protesters have shown that the power of community organisation can upset the corporatisation of the education apple cart. Academies are equally unpopular amongst teachers and parents alike and by working *togeffer mebbe* they can learn the government proper.

RETURN OF THE MUMIA

Mumia Abu Jamal is a black American activist who has been on death row since 1982 for the alleged murder of Philadelphia Police Officer Daniel Faulkner. Despite getting a mention in SchNEWS as far back as issue 27 (see also SchNEWS 34, 228), in the years since, numerous appeals to present forensic and ballistic evidence and eyewitness testimonies to his innocence have all been blocked by the courts and he remains in jail, with stays of execution forced partly by mass public protests and support.

The (former) Black Panther was earning a few quid taxi driving, when he spotted his brother getting beaten by a cop, as was the custom at the time (not that it's changed much since). Abu-Jamal got out to help but was shot in the stomach by another policeman before he reached the scene, and suffered a near-fatal wound. In the melee, the cop beating Abu-Jamal's brother was also fatally shot - but by a man who in no way resembled Abu-Jamal (who's quite distinctive with long flowing dreadlocks), as attested by many of the nearby witnesses.

Having pulled through from his injuries, Mumia was charged with murder, closely related to the fact that, as a journalist, he had been highlighting the state's harassment of the radical black ecological group MOVE. The fit up included police intimidation of witnesses, vital evidence not being examined, and a biased judge, famed for sentencing more men to death than any other in America.

Despite all the evidence proving his innocence, Mumia remains inside and a legal campaign has fought several attempts to execute him. For more see www.mumia.org/freedom. now and www.freemumia.org

John Bowden is an anarchist and former member of the Angry Brigade who famously brought explosive direct action to the streets of Britain in the late 1960s / early 70s. A long-term prison resister, he has spent most of his life behind bars, including 25 years of a 'Life' sentence. During that time he has written extensively and eloquently about his own experiences and the conditions of others – including an article about racism in prisons published in SchNEWS 528.

After being moved to 'open' conditions last year, and being let out for fortnightly home-leaves, the indications were that John might be released on licence this June. But it appears that a right-wing parole office, Matt Stillman, has been attempting to block John's release. His March 12th report highlighted visits to John by the prisoner support group the Anarchist Black Cross (ABC), which he attempts to smear with the terrorism brush as being made up "primarily of eco-terrorists or paramilitary members involved in what they see as battles against political systems and principles."

With John's parole hearing due in the next two weeks, letters to Matt Stillman (Fax: 01382 360510, The Parole board of England & Wales, Grenadier House, 99-105 Horseferry Road, London SW1P 2DD) and its chairman (duncan. nichol@paroleboard.gov.uk) are needed to help pressure them into a non-reactionary decision.
