



SQUARING UP TO 'EM AS PROTESTERS PREPARE TO GIVE THE TORYS A WARM WELCOME.

Only four days into the brave new Libservative era and the population is getting into the national coalition-building mood - a rag-tag rainbow alliance of the disaffected is set to pitch up in Parliament Square this Saturday (15th). But will it be a strong, stable protest in the national interests?

Rave Against The Machine 2 - Parliament Square street party and sound clash, 4pm-11pm. "A smashing good day out!" Enjoy the carnival and spectacle of a country pissed off with its 'leaders'! "Just like the last party, invite your friends, and bring booze!" Fuck The Torys! Fuck The Lib Dems! And Fuck Labour!

The **Democracy Village** was established in Parliament Square on May 1st (see SchNEWS 721) demanding on behalf of the majority of people that the war in Afghanistan is ended and the troops are brought home with immediate effect. Guerilla Gardening - Brighten up Parliament Square - which is in desperate need of colourful flora. Starting at 12pm - bring plants, flowers and picnic food. From 4pm there will be live music, an open mic, and a discussion forum. http://democracyvillage.blogspot.com

NOT A CLEGG TO STAND ON

So the honeymoon is underway for Nick & Dave, who surprised friends and relatives with a shotgun wedding this week, despite having been heard for a number of years forcefully listing all the reasons why the other is a complete twat. But what are the prospects for a happy marriage – as far as the rest of us are concerned?

Welcome to the real arrival of the Age of Austerity, due since the day the financial crisis broke but propped up and put back til the election was finally over.

Swinging cuts across the whole public services sector (well you can't expect them to skimp on 'defence'!) is not likely to ingratiate them with anybody but bankers and the richest slice of society.

And of course cuts don't begin to cover the black hole of debt. Large tax hikes - direct and indirect - are inevitable (a VAT rise looks likely for instance - which taxes the poorest most) as well as a certain amount of deliberate inflation (such as, but not limited to the recent 'quantitative easing'). This is basically another indirect tax which reduces the real value of everybody's assets in order to make the fixed-amount government debts smaller in real terms.

And then there's Europe – the biggest crack in the Cam-Clegg cabal – which is lurching through a period of financial crisis and threatens to make everyone's recession even worse. The just-announced trillion dollar bailout is just that - a bailout – not any kind of solution to the underlying problems.

It's papering over the cracks and basically

the 'richer' countries – those with smaller, more manageable debt mountains than the others – have agreed to borrow even huger amounts to prop up the system in the short term. Much like the global minimal action on the environment, it fails to recognise that delaying an inevitable crisis only makes its impact bigger and more overwhelming when it eventually happens.

Politicians are scared of the market's reactions to, and the political consequences of, allowing Greece (and potentially others) to default. It could kill the Euro, and lead to a crisis of confidence threatening the whole euro-superstate project. So they're throwing the kitchen sink at keeping the status quo going.

But without debt restructuring and cancellation, some economists (even MOR FT types) think that all the problems faced down now will be back, bigger and more uncontainable, within three years.

And it could be sooner than that if the Greeks don't start meekly accepting their bitter austerity pills more readily than they have been. Pausing after an intense period of mass riots, deaths and pitch battles with riot cops (see SchNEWS 711, 720), more general strikes and actions are planned, starting on May 20th. The elites had better hope than the Spanish, Portuguese, Irish and ...er, British aren't watching and getting any ideas about how to respond when the next levels of Austerity get imposed...

GLADE RAGS

Glade is the latest in a string of festivals to be forced to cancel its frivolities because of police pressure to increase security and stewarding. Big Green Gathering (see SchNEWS 685), Strawberry Fair (see SchNEWS 715) and now Glade have all succumbed to the underhand tactics of police who refuse to negotiate in advance but push for licence reviews that would not come to a decision until days before the festival is supposed to start.

All three festivals have reported huge support from local councils despite the police's demands. The bottom line now seems to be if you try to keep your festie free of corporate sponsorship and refuse to pay disproportionate sums of money for extra policing, it doesn't happen.

SWEATY PALMS AT UNILEVER

German protest group Robin Wood have been targeting cosmetics and food giant Unilever over the last few days, following them around Europe to take action at shareholder meetings in Rotterdam and London and the German headquarters in Hamburg.

The activists are protesting against Unilever's involvement in the mass destruction of rainforest to produce palm oil - the cheap fat that, these days, is in pretty much everything from frozen pizza to Vanish.

Protesters unfurled banners saying 'Unilever – Unscrupulous Destruction of Rainforest and Community for Palm Oil' and leafletted the shareholders, informing them of the eco-cidal business the corporation is in.

Hundreds of thousands took to the streets across the US on May Day as Arizona immigration law erupted in mass rallies.

Protesters in more than 70 cities (including Los Angeles, Dallas, Chicago, Phoenix, Washington, Boston and New York) across the land of opportunity marched for the rights of migrants that are being bludgeoned, reminiscent of the unsuccessful attempt for federal legislation four years previously which would have made being a non-status immigrant a felony. Demonstrations had already been held in response to Arizona's recent ruling but Saturday's marches were by far the largest held to date, including 50,000 in LA and 6,500 in New York.

Arizona's severe new immigration legislation, which is due to take effect from July 29th, will make it possible for law enforcement teams to interrogate people about their citizen status if they suspect they don't carry proper documentation, creating fears of inciting further racism and discrimination. There are an estimated 12 million people living illegally in the U.S.

Protesters included a coalition (groan) of activists, families, students and immigrant organisations as well as prominent political, religious and media figures. Congressman, Luis Gutierrez the representative for the state of Illinois, was arrested along with 35 other people during a sit-in outside the White House which defied orders from the police. Protesters are usually required to stay in motion when demonstrating in front of the White House. It was a reminder to Obama to fulfill his campaign promises to achieve immigration reform. RAISING ARIZONA

On Tuesday 11th, France's CRS riot squad raided 'Africa House', the squat in Calais of African migrants. Six riot vans full of police and two unmarked 'arrest' vans arrived to round people up for the crime of having no papers. They spent an hour combing the building and eventually left with 23 people. Most people were only held for a few hours before being made to make the long walk from the Coquelles detention centre back into town.

A day later the police rounded up five Hazara Afghans who are camping out in the shrubbery near the old hover port and also five Palestinians trying to make it to the UK in a truck. The CRS units receive a 1000 euro bonus at the end of a tour of duty if they exceed their arrest quota of migrants. Policing of migrants has been transformed into bounty-hunting.

Police raids on 'jungles' are an almost daily occurrence and are part of a concerted campaign of repression by the French state to make Calais a mi-

CRUDE AWAKENING

Also in the USA, anger overflowed this Tuesday (11th) as protesters outraged by BP's massive oil spill in the Gulf marched on the White House bearing a fifty foot banner saying "President Obama: this is your crude awakening". They were drawing attention to the fact that BPs man-made disaster is compounding the pressure put on the local environment by Hurricane Katrina. Eleven workers died after the explosion, and tarballs are slowly but surely now washing up on shore.

Demonstrators aimed their vitriol at Barack Obama, who has been a supporter of the expansion of offshore drilling as the White House defended its drilling plan last Thursday (May 6th) even in the wake of the spill. The US Govt said it would work closely with members of Congress and state governors in any process to open up new areas for offshore drilling.

grant free zone. In April 2009 the French minister of immigration, Eric Besson, vowed to drive all migrants out of Calais. In September of that year the process began with the smashing of the large Pashtun 'jungle' and the arrest of 278 people. Since then all pre-existing squats and jungles have been evicted with the exception of Africa House, which is set for demolition in the next two months.

On Saturday 8th, as Calais celebrated the defeat of the Nazis, No Borders activists and migrants organised a march through Calais to highlight their situation. Two No Borders activists attempted to display photos of police brutality at the official commemoration at the town hall but were swiftly dragged away by the police along with two observers and detained until the rally ended.
