# **BRUSSELS SPROUTS CAMP**

#### NO BORDERS HEADS TO BELGIUM TO FIGHT EU IMMIGRATION POLICIES

No Borders Camp 2010 in Brussels kicks off this Saturday (25th) til the 3rd October, and plenty are converging on that part of the continent in an effort to create a world where no one is illegal. Among the objectives of the camp are the denouncing of European migration policy; showing the links between this policy and the structures of capitalism and repression; the blocking of Brussels' deportation system and the organisation of an autonomous safe space for the voices of migrants and activists to be heard.

#### WHERE WILL IT BE?

The camp plans to take space at TOUR&TAXIS, a complex in the heart of Brussels with green areas and buildings usually used for conferences and events. There's plenty of room for upwards of 1,000 people and finding it is pretty easy once you're in the city - check out the travel advice on the website. There's also a section on an anarchopedia website to find travelling partners or arrange liftshares. A decentralised info point will be set up at Gésu, an abandoned monastery which is squatted by around 130 people; from there you can find out what's going on at the camp.

#### **HOW DOES IT ALL WORK?**

Different working groups have been responsible for different aspects of the camp and will continue to do so on site, although all decision are made by consensus. The program group co-ordinates proposals for workshops and affinity group actions, and sets locations and times for activities during the camp; the finance group and logistics group take care of money and materials. Support will be provided by the legal and medical teams. There is a dedicated Big Demo working group to plan for the mass action on the 2nd October, but self-organised and autonomous actions are actively welcomed during the week too. A mobilisation group will be on hand to assist. The process group will be going round making sure that every proposal is running smo othly and nothing gets forgotten. Food will be cooked on site and organised by the kitchen team. Participation in these working groups

is open to everyone at the camp.

A general assembly will be held every morning during the camp for decisions to be made, issues to be raised, and for briefings from the different working groups to be given. Workshops will also run throughout the week with a different theme each day: European migration policy, detention & deportations, capitalism & migration, the struggle of migrants, and the militarisation of borders, all culminating in the mass demo day on the 2nd, then debrief the day after. There will be photo exhibitions and a cinema showing informative films while other spaces in the city will host debates, gigs and cabaret.

There is a general policy of no photos or filming on site, even for campers. Journalists will only be allowed into the area at allotted times, escorted, and if you're in shot, you'll be asked for your permission before they take any pictures or film. A dedicated media team will be taking care of this.

#### WHAT DO I NEED?

Whatever camping gear will make you comfy, and if you're happy to leave stuff like tents and sleeping bags behind at the camp after you leave, it will go to migrants and activists who are camping out permanently in Calais and Brussels and desperately need it.

The logistics group also have a long wishlist of tat and equipment which you can find on the website, so have a read through before you leave in case you happen to be the one who has 300m of plumbing hose lying around in your back garden.


#### AND THE COPPERS?

Generally aren't that bad, and the legal team will be on hand, but there are a few things to watch out for..

Belgian police like to break cameras so although its not forbidden to film them or take pictures, make sure you're doing it out of arms reach.

It's an offence to cover your face with masks, scarves or make-up in Brussels so be prepared to get arrested and have a fine slapped on you if you can't overcome your shyness.

Obviously don't bring anything that can



be considered a weapon (even instructions for an oragami crowbar) and if they find drugs on you (even cannabis) they'll arrest and/or fine you.

The Belgian police do use pepper spray, horses and sometimes water cannons for 'riot control'.

If you're a foreigner, the police can hold you for a maximum of 24 hours without charge. The clock starts from the moment they grab you – not when you get to the police station or are put in a van.

You don't have to give your name at any point during your Belgian custodial experience, but if you don't, it's likely you'll be held for the maximum possible time while they try and find out who you are. Staying anonymous won't stop you from getting charged and sentenced if the police are determined to follow through on an arrest.

As they arrest you they have to tell you what it's for, and if you are released without charge, you'll be asked to sign a register that details who the arresting officer was, why they took you into custody, and the times of your arrest and release. If the details aren't complete or you don't think they're right, don't sign it.

If they do charge you, and haven't released you after 24hrs, it mean that a judge has issued an arrest warrant and a trial will follow. The police can hold you like this for up to 5 days, and you only get the right to a lawyer once the arrest warrant has been issued.

As standard, keep schtum and decline to answer any questions or make any statements, and don't sign a written statement or 'proces verbaal' (PV) as its known in Belgium.

You have the normal rights to a translator, food and hygiene supplies and medical aid.

If they try and deport you at any point, they'll have to get you to sign a deportation order. Don't do it. You're protected as an EU citizen so tell them you're appealing on the basis of EU law.

### **REWRITE HIS-TORY**

On October 20th, David Cameron's old school chum George 'Tossy' Osbourne is due to finally announce details of the full horror of the government's plans to rescue the economy - so nearly ruined by the actions of the bankers and corporations - by getting the poorest to pay for it all. Up to 30% slashings are expected across public services and benefits. If only there were a convenient focus for all that rising anger and need to protest.

Oh yes, the Tory party conference is taking place in Birmingham starting on Sunday Oct 3rd. How handy.

In addition to the usual union and trot run events, an anti-authoritarian bloc is organising under the old-school (if slightly unimaginative) banner of 'Toffs Out'. With the event sponsored and basically paid for by non-exclusively Toff corporations such as RBS, British Aerospace, Group 4, ASDA and Tesco, perhaps it's more a case of 'All Out'.

The meeting point for the unathourised march will be announced on Saturday night and it will converge on the ICC building for a high-noon showdown on Sunday. Check the website for a list of other targets – or fringe events as the Tories call them.

Demo organisers have said they will do everything in their power to stop people attending the event, including direct action and civil disobedience. A Reclaim the Streets party is planned and squats will be available for those wanting to go on through the night.

## **ALL MEX'D UP**

The besieged Mexican autonomous community San Juan Copala has been evacuated after an outbreak of paramilitary violence left five seriously injured and one dead.

Around 500 gunmen took over San Juan Copala's town hall last Monday (13th). According to reports from the community, they spent the days that followed raking the town with constant gunfire, as well as going from house to house beating residents and burning the homes of those who had already fled the violence.

Last Friday (17th), the paramilitaries issued a statement threatening to massacre the 50 families that had stayed in the town if they didn't leave immediately. All but two of the families have now managed to escape. The two families left are now completely surrounded by gunmen.

In the town square of the city of Oaxaca, women and children, camping there in protest since being forced out of their homes in August, have now gone on hunger strike in an attempt to pressure the government to send police in to evacuate the remaining families.

The community declared itself autonomous in January 2007 following the Oaxaca uprising which nearly drove the governor out of office (see SchNEWS 567). It has been under siege since February when paramilitaries cut off water and electricity and blockaded the town. Earlier this year, attempts to break the siege by international and Mexican activists ended violently when the paramilitaries opened fire on the caravans – in one incidence, killing two (see SchNEWS 726).

Community members have claimed governor Ulises Ruiz Ortiz is behind the two paramilitary groups, Movement for Triqui Unification and Struggle (MULT) and the Union for the Social Well-being of the Triqui Region (UBISORT), who are responsible for around 20 deaths and numerous beatings, rapes and disappearances.

#### RUNNING HAM-MOCK

More shenanigans at the end of the rainbow this week as those plucky campers in Rossport, Ireland (see SchNEWS 737) make more moves to stop Shell stealing their country's lucky charms.

At 7am on Monday (20th) nine activists swam out to a drilling platform. Two strung themselves up in a hammock just under the platform, flanked by another two in kayaks and the rest in the water. By 9am the kayakers and swimmers had all been dragged back to shore and one drill on the platform was put to work.

Following complaints over the health and safety of the two suspended demonstrators, the drill was stopped temporarily, but work carried on later while the two layabouts continued to swing in their not so relaxing surroundings for the next 12 hours.

Contractors' sub-sea-quent peace and quiet didn't last long though as another 13 protesters waded out to a platform on Wednesday (22nd) and this time three amphibious activists set up in a hammock, stopping the drilling platform being moved to a new location. Equipped with water and food, the last SchNEWS heard is that they were still there; hopefully the wind and waves won't take their toll too soon.

The direct action coincides with the lengthy hearing into the project, where Shell representatives and 'expert' witnesses have been facing a grilling from locals and activists about the proposed raw gas pipeline.

Others from the local area and Rossport Solidarity Camp managed to stop Shell big wigs getting onto their hotel-bound bus last Thursday (16th) after a long day in the hearing. An 80-page submission this Wednesday (22nd) by An Taisce has called for the already extended hearing to be adjourned due to shady tactics by Shell. It remains to be seen whether this will get the result they want.

# **STOCKHOLME SYNDROME**

Thousands hit the streets of Sweden this Monday (20th) after election results on Sunday showed that far-right party, the 'Sweden Democrats' had managed to slither their way into parliament for the first time.

A populist xenophobic party with Nazi-fringe roots, the party now clasps the balance of power between the two larger factions of centre-right and left. With neither the opposition party nor the government with a majority, the bigoted anti-immigrant bunch are looking to demand influence or cause congressional mayhem. But as Prime Minister Fredrik Reinfeldt, currently trying to form an uneasy coalition with the Green party, announced, "There is no need to use words like chaos". Right you are.

Spontaneous protests erupted in Stockholm as the announcement went out that 20 parliamentary seats had been allocated to the racists. The vexed crowds, an estimated 6,000, waved the obligatory banners and shouted the required slogans, "No to racism!" but lamentably lacked projectiles. There was a smaller similar protest in Gothenburg.

During elections, the two main parties chose to ignore the far-right's existence. This gave the Sweden Democrats the opportunity to play upon public unease over immigration policy and put forward their nationalist "solutions". Following the Dutch elections earlier this year, which saw Islamaphobe Geert Wilders' 'Party for Freedom' became the third largest party in the Netherlands, it seems that even Europe's perceived liberal bastions are falling foul of efforts to infect them all with Islamaphobia.

## **GOOD CHAP ON TRIAL**

Simon Chapman, the British protester royally stictched up by Greek police after anti-EU protests in 2003, is about to once again appear in a Greek court as he appeals an eight year sentence for rioting and possessing explosives.

Simon was arrested along with six others following an immigration solidarity demo the day before the EU summit. Video and photo evidence showed how police put molotov cocktails in black bags then strapped them to him as he lay bleeding on the ground, after a police beating (see SchNEWS 413). After a 56-day hunger strike by the inmates and an international solidarity campaign brought Greece a wave of negative publicity at the blatant fit up, the seven were released later that year.

However, once the media storm had blown out, and with no sense of the shame in again ignoring the irrefutable evidence against their version of events, the Greek authorities revived the case and re-instated the charges. In 2008 Simon was sentenced to eight and a half years in his absence for rioting, and the construction, possession and use of explosives. Some of the others were either found not guilty, or guilty of lesser non-imprisonable charges, but some received 5 years.

The appeal against the convictions and ludicrously inflated sentences, which begins today (24th) will see Simon stand trial again alongside three other defendants.

\* The EDL targeted Newcastle on Wednesday (22nd) evening, in the latest of a series small, violent confrontations. Around 30 men wearing EDL shirts attacked an SWP meeting in the city centre, beating two door staff.

Earlier that day, when two EDL supporters were arrested in Gateshead, a flash mob descended on the cop shop in support of the nicked knuckleheads. The rumour flying around the EDL forum is that the two were busted in a dawn raid by anti-terror police for Qu'ran burning, and later released. At the time of press that remained unconfirmed by anyone with an IO over 60.
