

"If you want a picture of the future, imagine a boot stamping on a human face - forever."-George Orwell, Nineteen Eighty Four.

It's the largest electronic monitoring station in the world. The Big Brother of all global spy installations, it's gigantic golf balls listening in on our every word. The Menwith Hill spy base near Harrogate in North Yorkshire, is run by America's National Security Agency (NSA), part of their global network of spy bases, which monitors the world's communications and relays information back to NSA HQ at Fort Meade in Maryland, USA.

One of Menwith's spying systems is called Echelon which as one report put it "has sifted the private international messages, telegrams, and telephone calls of citizens, corporations or governments to select information of political, military or economic value to the United States." (see SchNEWS 379). Meanwhile Britain's very own GCHQ staff filter through 'key word' information, then pass any juicy segments onto the likes of MI5, Special Branch and Scotland Yard. It's believed that Menwith is capable of tapping two million telephone calls an hour.

Since 1951, the giant NSA base has occupied land in a "secret relationship" between the US Air Force and the Ministry of Defence. It employs more than 1,800 staff, the majority from America, and the everexpanding spy station covers over 560 acres of land, surrounded by a security fence topped with razor wire, watched by CCTV cameras and patrolled by Ministry of Defence Police.

Journalist Duncan Campbell who has spent years monitoring Menwith said "Although it is impossible for analysts to listen to all but a small fraction of the billions of telephone calls, and other signals which might contain 'significant' information, a network of monitoring stations in Britain and elsewhere is able to tap all international and some domestic communications circuits, and sift out messages which sound interesting. Computers automatically analyse every telex message or data signal, and can also identify calls to, say, a target telephone number in London, no matter from which country they originate."

Menwith played a crucial role in both Gulf wars and even won an award for its work during the first one. It is also central to plans for the "Star Wars" National Missile Defence programme which is part of America's plans for "Full Spectrum Dominance", giving the US control of space itself. Washington says the missile defence system is designed to protect the US from the potential new threat of missiles fired by "rogue" states such as North Korea, Iran and er, Iraq. However US bases in Britain will be used not for the defence of Britain, or even of continental Europe, but just for the good 'ole US of A!

## **ROPE BURNS** The British activist Martin Shaw, who was

seriously injured when police cut his ropes during a climbing action against the G8 summit, is still in hospital in Lausanne. He is now out of intensive care having undergone operations for two broken vertebrae, a broken pelvis, ankle and foot, but looks likely to remain bed bound for at least another six weeks. At some point he will require further surgery to remove the bolts holding his ankle and foot together. SchNEWS has also received graphic descriptions of the state of his genitals, but we're much too squeamish to pass it on. Just think aubergines.

Martin, along with the woman activist that climbed with him and another six who participated in the action, has been charged with blocking traffic on a motorway. Shaw says: "There seems to be a desire from the Swiss government to forget about this whole event. No charges have been brought against the police who cut the rope or those who set up the operation, but we are working to mount a legal case against the police and the Swiss government.3

The support group helping Martin are in the process of finding a lawyer to bring a civil compensation claim, and criminal charges against the Swiss police. Guy Smallman, a photographer covering the G8 summit protests for Images Sans Frontieres had his left calf torn off after a German copper took aim and fired a succession of concussion grenades right at Guy. One witness has suggested that police were unhappy about him taking pictures of their actions before and during the build-up to the attack.

The MK3A2 offensive hand grenade otherwise known as a concussion grenade, and fast becoming the weapon of choice for riot police worldwide, is a military weapon designed to produce casualties during close combat while minimizing danger to 'friendly personnel'.

The NUJ's National Freelance Organiser John Toner said: "Once again police have seized the opportunity...to target a working journalist. We are making a strong protest to the Swiss government which apparently invited in the police of a foreign power to attack a demonstration.'

## GROUP4 ANALYSIS

Group4 the 'security' firm who managed to burn down Yarlswood Detention Centre last February, are now trying to recruit staff for the Centre, which is due to reopen in September. After failing to recruit enough Custody Officers at their first open day, their second open day on Thursday was again disrupted by protesters, who informed applicants what the job really involved - the arbitrary and indefinite detention of men, women and children who have accused of not been any crime. www.barbedwirebritain.org.uk

As much as 40 per cent of what households throw away in their bins is compostable, and yet the UK currently composts just 3 per cent of its total waste. So instead of being put in a compost bin and being turned into organic fertiliser for the garden, it gets thrown into landfill sites where it produces methane, a potent 'greenhouse' gas and 'leachate', a liquid pollutant that can contaminate ground water supplies. **TB or not TB** Over the past 25 years over 30,000 badgers have been gassed or shot in an attempt by the government to try and prove a link between the spread of bovine tuberculosis (bTB) in cattle and badgers. Despite spending £7 million a year on the research, no link has been found and bTB has spread to new areas of the UK. According to animal welfare groups the reality is that bTB is spread from cow to cow, on the farm and in the marketplace, and the increase in infection is due to poor standards in animal health due to intensive farming practices. Very little effort has so far been put into looking into cattle to cattle transfer of the disease. Last month, the controversial badger cull began again in North Devon after a three month closed season. The Coalition of Badger Action Groups is co-ordinating actions against the cull, but it really is a race against time with traps being set at the moment. ## BECHTEL BASICS

Early last Thursday morning, several hundred peaceful protesters blocked the entrances to Bechtel headquarters in San Francisco in protest at the corporation's involvement in the war against Iraq. Police, who outnumbered protesters, made numerous arrests and eventually got the building opened around lunchtime, by which time many employees had been told to take the day off.

Bechtel have got one of biggest rebuilding contracts in Iraq. Worth \$680 million over 18 months, it includes rebuilding and repairing everything from electrical grids to water and sewage systems. The contract was, naturally, granted in backroom deals without open and transparent bidding processes, and the content remains hidden behind a veil of secrecy. Corporate Watch say that "details of the contract have not been publicly disclosed to American taxpayers, who will be paying the majority of the bill. While there is no doubt that Bechtel has experience in these areas, it is an experience from which the people of Iraq should be spared.
