

"If Tony Blair gives the green light for GM, then a nation of gardeners will put on their gardening gloves, take GM crops out of the ground and make sure that the people have the last word on protecting our future." – The Green Gloves Pledge.

Last week the results of the "GM Nation?" public debate were revealed and they showed that the British public overwhelmingly rejected the growing of genetically modified crops in Britain: 86% were unhappy with the idea of eating the stuff and 84% thought they would damage the environment.

The biotech companies are no doubt gutted that their expensive PR and marketing hadn't mislead us all into swallowing their 'GM is great' crap. So what did these biotech bullshitters have to say for themselves? The biggest biotech company in the UK is Bayer CropScience and Paul Rylott, head of the company's BioScience Unit, is also - what a surprise - chair of the Agricultural Biotechnology Council. Now if you haven't got a problem with that, you'll be cool about his appointment earlier this year to the Agriculture and Environment Biotechnology Council (AEBC), the government's advisory body on GM crops in the environment. He complained that "public meetings do not equal public opinion" which is pretty odd considering him and his chums had filled special consultation focus groups with people who had previously thought that GM might be a good thing. But unfortunately for them even these groups rejected GM crops! The report concluded: "The more people engage in GM issues, the harder their attitudes and more intense their concerns." The report also highlighted the fact no-one trusts the biotech companies with 93% of respondents believing GM technology was driven by profit rather than public interest.

Last week a national day of action against Bayer, saw their phones/faxes/emails blockaded and sites in Cambridge and Widnes targeted. In Widnes the protesters managed to shut down work for a bit. So worried were Bayer that an announcement went over the tannoy to employees to close and lock all doors and windows. Even the security guards locked themselves in their office, which makes one wonder what they're actually paid for... Two protesters managed to speak with the manager who told them "rest assured, you have sent a ripple through Bayer CropScience."

This ripple turned into a wave when a couple of days later Bayer announced that they were pulling out of GM crop trials in Britain - the reason given being that "They are always ripped up." More proof that direct action works. But this isn't time to get complacent and think that GM crops are dead and buried. For a start Bayer have only announced that they are pulling out of trials until conditions are "more favourable". As the biggest GM crop company in Britain they're also pushing ahead with the commercialisation of GM crops. So the anti-GM campaign is set to roll on, with much 'field work' and many more actions planned.

Growing Dissent

A recently leaked report assessing the GM farm scale crop trials revealed more surprising good news for anti-GM campaigners - it showed that two out of the three varieties under trial caused significantly more damage to the environment than conventional crops. The full report is due out on the 16th October and it seems likely to be a bumper harvest of anti-GM facts. This follows two other reports commissioned by the government, which were critical of GM - showing there was no economic necessity for them and highlighting the potentially dangerous environmental effects. Combined with the public rejection of GM this is causing pro-GM Tony Blair, if not to reverse his policy, then at least to consider slowing down.

However Tony maybe able to avoid making himself even more unpopular if new EU and international trade laws make the banning of GM crops by any country illegal. In Europe there's currently a moratorium on new GM crops being grown, but this is due to end, and the European Commission recently ruled that no country or region can rule itself GM free. This has all come following intense pressure from the US, who are taking the EU to the World Trade Organisation courts saying the moratorium and even labelling food as GM is a barrier to trade. Europe's caution has already cost the American biotech companies an estimated \$30 billion. So if the US gets its way you might never know if you're eating GM foods.

The so-called free market may well force GM crops into the fields and down our throats. To stop this we'll have to take to the fields for a bit of decontamination gardening and targeting the companies producing the unwanted GM products. Time to have a field day, folks!

TRASH CROPS

Brazil has recently allowed the commercial growing of GM crops. However this is limited to one year and will be limited only to the southern province of Rio Grande do Sul. The farmers will have to sign a document making them responsible for any damage to health or the environment.

Meanwhile three weeks ago while the WTO were meeting in Cancun, Mexico, farmers in India trashed a Monsanto research station in Bangalore. Monsanto India said "One greenhouse was destroyed. We lost valuable plants and are seriously concerned." SchNEWS reckons Monsanto Brazil are gonna have to make a similar statement sometime in the near future.

BOURNE-LIARS

It's been a busy week for corporations and lobby groups who've been sponsoring fringe events, holding receptions and setting up exhibition stalls at the Neo Labour Party Conference hoping to get special favours from the government.

Friends of the Earth, fed up with all this corporate brown-nosing, have for the second year running dished out the Exposed Awards, highlighting the most environmentally and socially damaging of those on parade in Bournemouth.

Worthy winners the Confederation of British Industry (CBI) won the award for being "extremely backward in its approach to regulation, regularly lobbying against measures to protect the environment (e.g. the Climate Change Levy) or to give people more rights."

Shortly behind in second place was weapons manufacturer BAE Systems, a "master of 'greenwash', having run a massive advertising campaign describing itself as a 'global systems company' which provides 'protection from the storm'", but which in reality is "the world's second largest arms producer and manufactures many of the missiles (containing depleted uranium) that rain down upon the victims of war... BAE has benefited from the war in Iraq but has also been the subject of widely reported allegations of corruption over arms deals with Saudi Arabia."

In third place was supermarket giant Tesco. Tesco held a fringe debate at the Conference "Promising the Earth? Food, Farming and Rural Communities." Tesco has amongst other things been busy shafting farmers and helping to close local shops (Tesco now account for 12% of all sales in the UK) "while making worthless promises in glossy brochures."

Other highlights include Nestle sponsoring a fringe meeting by the Foreign Policy Centre. Nestle's 'foreign policy' is one that pushes its powdered baby milk products over breast milk in poor countries where everyday 4,000 babies die from unsafe bottle feeding.

Barclays Bank spoke at a Social Market Foundation fringe meeting on whether 'Labour can bridge the inequality gap.' Not when two of their greedy bastard directors take home over $\pounds 1.6$ million a year.

Not to be outdone the Mobile Operators' Association sponsored a Social Market Foundation fringe meeting on how planning decisions can be speeded up. This lobby group is made up of the big five mobile phone companies who are obviously keen to get mobile phone masts plastered all over the country quick sharp and are fed up with local residents trying to stop them.

FORCE OF WILL

Disgusted by their country's murderous occupation of the Palestinian territories, 27 Israeli air force fighter pilots have signed a letter refusing to participate in operations against civilian targets. This brings the number of refusers in Israel's armed and air forces to 1148.

Desperate to stem a rising refusenik tide, the Israeli authorities have summoned nine of the pilots to disciplinary meetings. If the pilots don't retract their statement, they will be dismissed from serving in the air force. In reaction to a debate on the matter held by the air force's Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, the pilots said that "The very same committee that supports an unethical policy that leads to the killings of innocent citizens on both sides, is today attempting to preach morals to us."

Inside SchNEWS

On the night of the 15th of September five raids occurred in Barcelona; six anarchists were arrested; one has since been released. Charges include sending a book-bomb, urban terrorism, planning two assassinations, illegal possession of firearms, arson attacks and belonging to a terrorist group. They allegedly "took part in a campaign of urban attacks in Barcelona in March." The infamously violent and corrupt Guardia Civil claims to have found a revolver, a gun, different chemical materials, timer devices and two manuals for the production of explosives.

The investigation, which is still officially open, concerns connections with two Italian anarchists already in prison in Spain and with groups active in other European countries – apparently illegal?! They're also being charged with the unexploded letter bomb which was sent to the Greek embassy in Madrid to protest the arrests in Thessaloniki. The five now find themselves isolated without the possibility of communication either with their lawyers or with their families. They are being treated under Spain's "licence to torture" antiterrorist laws, which recently saw the editor of the Basque magazine 'Egunkaria' tortured while in custody.

This is part of an ongoing campaign against anarchist groups in Spain which started almost a year ago with the arrest of 4 people in Valencia, followed by four more 10 months later. Repression also hit Barcelona with 4 arrests in February of this year and one in the same operation in Almeria. The mass media and government fuel public hysteria with trumped up stories of connections to ETA or Al Qaeda, misinformation and smear campaigns. Police figures have been quoted without questioning and the detained have also had their photos, names and addresses released, against the privacy codes which protect those awaiting trial.

* Kastro Dakduk, a Syrian living in Greece, was one of several people beaten up and arrested under false charges at protests against the EU conference in Thessaloiki, Greece in June (see SchNEWS 413). Currently on remand in Greece and faces a long prison sentence. The Greek authorities plan to deport him back to Syria. If deported, Kastro's life would be in danger as he fled Syria to escape persecution for his political beliefs. Fighting for his life, Kastro has now gone on hunger strike.
