# CARD SHARKS

"The technology gap between governments and organised crime has now narrowed to such an extent that even the most highly secure cards are available as blanks weeks after their introduction. Criminals and terrorists can in reality move more freely and more safely with several fake "official" identities than they ever could in a country using multiple forms of "low-value" ID such as a birth certificate." - Simon Davies, Privacy International.

With the ID cards Home Secretary Blunkett is bringing in legislation for next January, Neo Labour is playing on its two strengths: stripping us of civil liberties and committing us to privatised corporate 'outsourcing' fiascos.

At first it will mean that those who apply for a new passport or driving license will be automatically issued with an identity card and their personal details stored on a new national identity computer database (see SchNEWS 422 & 363). They will also have to undergo hi-tech electronic eye and fingerprint scans – called biometric data - to allegedly prevent the new ID being forged. Now - these cards won't be 'compulsory' at first, but the clever plan is that by 2013, 80% of the population will have them – and it'll be then that Big Brother might just decide to make 'em compulsory for access to public services.

Mark Littlewood from Liberty says that "all the evidence from other European countries suggests that ID cards are expensive, ineffective and damage community relations. In Britain, opinion polls show that several million adults would refuse point blank to carry one." But at least you will have some extra room in yer hip pocket to fit the card in after having paid double for the cost of passports or driving licenses to fund the scheme.

The consolation is that the ID card system is not likely to work. Privacy International has dubbed the scheme "mathematically and technologically" impossible because of problems with biometric data. US government reports have already exposed massive problems; the largest iris database so far contains 30,000 records, and there is no knowledge or experience of how a database of 60 million would work. PI also reckon that for the iris scan to work the system would need to be one million times more accurate than current available systems! Almost every other country that has considered this system has rejected it, including China.

This ID database, which will provide an enormous resource for the tracking and holding of data on individuals, is also planned to be used in combination with other government databases. Blunkett has also claimed that the cost of the card could be offset by "benefits to the commercial world". Oh right, we get it now, why didn't you say that at the beginning?

#### Matrix Rebooted

All this iris scanning and recorded information will be an enormous mountain of data to manage – but luckily it'll be in the hands of IT experts with good track records. Here's a few examples of government adventures into computer and IT technology to calm yer nerves:

Just this week a huge project to put all the nation's magistrates courts on one computer system was condemned in a report by the Commons public accounts committee as one of the worst public finance projects ever. The scheme, known as Libra, aimed to streamline more than 300 magistrates courts saving millions of pounds. In fact it did the opposite: The cost of installing 11,000 PCs in courts worked out at £21,000 per computer! The cost of operations tripled - and it doesn't work! An MPs report found: "The department... ran a poor competition, attracting only one bidder (ICL), and it failed to take decisive action when ICL did not deliver what was required. For its part, ICL did not understand the department's requirements, took on excessive risk and under-priced its bid."

A report, 'Public Interest, Private Profit', by the London Assembly's budget committee criticizes the way London's congestion charge has been handled by Capita who were recently fined £1m for poor performance in the first seven months of operation. London mayor Ken Livingstone came close to sacking Crapita, describing their customer services as "completely unacceptable". However he still gave them an extra £31 million in July to iron out problems - £3.5m going to improving computer systems, which ought to have been

## CRAP ARREST OF THE WEEK

For holding a banner!

US activist, Brent Bursey is going to court this week after being charged for holding a sign reading "No More War For Oil" at an airport in South Carolina last October. Bush was supposed to be arriving later that day and people had gathered to show him what they thought of the war on Iraq. Bursey was charged with trespassing, even though he was on public property, 'cos he hadn't been standing in the marked "free-speech zone." Protesters were only supposed to be half a mile away where nobody, least of all Bush, could see or hear them. Bursey told police he had been under the impression that the whole of America was a 'free speech zone' and local authorities dropped the charges. Six months later federal authorities renewed the case using a rarely enforced statute allowing the Secret Service to restrict access to areas near the president. If convicted, this charge carries a penalty of up to a \$5000 fine and six months in jail. Bursey is being denied a jury trial.

paid for by Crapita, rather than London's taxpayers. They are also responsible for the Criminal Records Bureau - where last year delays in completing checks on teachers caused some schools to open late last autumn.

According to some projections the government will be spending £13.1 billion a year on IT by 2005. This is 14 times more than the average spent by other European governments. The spin is that IT investment results in more efficient public services and therefore is money well spent, which might be true if any of it worked!

# Thessaloniki Hunger Strikers In Critical Condition

Seven protesters were fitted up and banged up at the anti-EU demonstrations in Thessaloniki, Greece last June. Simon Chapman from London had molotov cocktails placed in his bag as he lay bleeding on the ground after being beaten by police (See SchNEWS 413). Now five of the prisoners: Simon, Fernando Perez Gorraiz, Carlos Martin Martinez, from Spain, Souleiman "Kastro" Dakduk, a Syrian and Spyros Tsitsas, a Greek have been on hunger strike for between 39 and 56 days.

Last Friday they collectively decided to refuse liquid as well in protest at not being allowed to receive mail, having no toilet privacy rights and not being allowed to contact their lawyer. After two days the authorities granted them these concessions but then at 2am on Tuesday, without their lawyer's knowledge, all five were transported 400 miles to another prison hospital in Athens. Obviously seriously weakened, they were made to sit up for the whole journey in a cold cage in the back of a police van and weren't even given any blankets for the cold. When they

reached Athens, Fernando and Kastro were in such a bad way they were taken to a civilian hospital instead of the prison one where they remain, unable to move.

There are ongoing demonstrations and actions all over the country and abroad in solidarity with the **Thessaloniki 7** so get involved – this is really important as these guys may die very soon. #### Get Yer Bar End Away!

URGENT - Help is needed right now to help defend the tunnels and walkways preventing the completion of a park and ride on a meadow at Bar End near Winchester.

The story of Bar End goes back to the original Twyford Down road building in 1992-93 - the battleground which spawned the anti-roads movement. At the time the people of Winchester were promised as sort-of compensation for the destruction at Twyford Down that the site of the original Winchester by-pass would be returned to meadow land 'for perpetuity'. So the tarmac was removed, topsoil from Twyford Down put in its place and today it is a popular nature spot. Well now things have changed and the council want it back. A protester told SchNEWS that the vast majority of the locals don't want the park and ride, won't be using it, and that the whole scheme could be about extending the adjacent industrial park, which has got handy access to the M3.

"It's mad – they tarmac-ed the area for the Winchester by-pass, then they took that away

and made it a meadow... now they want to tarmac it again." says a Bar End protester.

This week the council cleared the way to bring heavy building equipment in to open the new park and ride, making an eviction eminent. The camp is registered as a land squat, but the council haven't applied for a court order to evict – so any eviction will be illegal. Added to this the Hampshire police have admitted already that they aren't too fussed about the finer legal points, and will call in 'colleagues' from other counties.

The camp is off Bar End Road, (an extension of Chesil Street) about a mile and half from the railway station. Or, leave the M3 at junction 10 and head for St Catherine's park and ride site, which is next to the proposed new site. The camp urgently needs people and tat now.

#### Subvert Central

Last Friday 500 people descended on the Paris métro armed with pots of glue, spray cans and colourful determination. More invaded the Brussel's metro with their own buckets of ideas. In Paris they split into groups of 40, radically repainting vulgar, buy-buy-buy advertising boards, transforming them with brushstrokes from private spaces for profits into public spaces of resistance. In Paris and Brussels subvertised advert boards screamed "No Adverts!", 'Advertising Kills", "The Street is Ours' "Advertising is Hazardous to Your Mental Health." In the end, 130 stations were reclaimed and repainted in Paris while 7 were visited in Brussels. All 40 adbusters arrested were quickly released back into a subvertised Paris.

These actions of mass redecoration were called by Stop Pub ('Stop Ads') and other collectives in France. The aim was to 'reconquer public space' in the face of mass privatisation, repressive neo-liberal states and a life drowned in empty, consumerist adverts. "Everything is seen as a commodity", said one ticketless adbuster, Gilles, "We don't want to be visually polluted." And to the hundreds of students, workers, artists, mums, dads and skaters that took part in these actions, the links between bigger adverts, less social rights and more cops was all too obvious. So the adbusters went calmly and non-violently from station to station, peacefully going about their decoration of vulgar car and clothes ads while chatting with the public and handing out info on the reasons for their actions. Métro passengers largely supported the actions, found them funny and in a few cases they even got their hands dirty doing some redecorating themselves.

This Thursday yet another action is planned. In the light of all this success, 16 organisations jumped on the adbusting train this week in France with Attac, Greenpeace and others starting a campaign against advertising. # ...and finally...

The Bush administration's crusade against environmentalists gained momentum last week with attorney-general Ashcroft wheeling out an 1870 law to launch a prosecution against Greenpeace. It is the first time an organisation has been prosecuted for the actions of individual members and could have serious civil liberties implications for environmental groups and free speech in general. If found guilty, Greenpeace will have to regularly report its activities to the government and will lose its tax-exempt status.

The law being used against Greenpeace has only ever been used twice before - in the nineteenth century - and was designed to prevent "sailor-mongers" from getting crew-members pissed, kidnapping them and then selling them on to another ship!

So is that the kind of thing Greenpeace activists are up to nowadays? Er...no. Their only crime was hanging a banner saying "Bush stop illegal logging" on a ship carrying Brazilian mahogany! But the Bush administration has hated Greenpeace since they first dubbed Dubya the "Toxic Texan" though we can't see why they should object to such an apt nick-name. Only last week the Poisonous President announced that investigations into 50 power plants charged with violating the Clean Air Act were to be dropped.
