"Ours are not Western values. They are the universal values of the human spirit and anywhere, anytime, ordinary people are given the chance to choose, the choice is the same. Freedom not tyranny. Democracy not dictatorship. The rule of law not the rule of the secret police." - Tony Blair, talking to the US Congress

It was Human Rights Day on Wednesday and Bush and Blair have had a busy year upholding these rights: locking up refugees, repressing dissent, bombing countries in the name of peace and exporting arms to dodgy regimes – all in the name of Freedom of course.

Britain is the only European Union country to detain asylum seeker children and practise detention without time limits. Luckily we've got Group 4 security looking after those banged up for the crime of wanting a better life. The company boasts that it has been "recognised by the Home Office for leadership in implementation of the Human Rights Act." Unfortunately this week's expose of its guards at the Yarlswood detention centre paints a bit of a different picture. During one session on human rights, trainees were told, "Now they (asylum seekers) are rowing over in dinghies. Sink them, that's what the Navy should be doing." And while the company talks of the need to "establish positive relationships" the undercover journalist was told, "Don't befriend them. Other officers will turn on you."

Recently at another detention centre, Campsfield, police clamped down on a demonstration in support of the detainees by imposing strict limits on the demonstrators and shoving them into a corner of a car park where no one could see them (see last week's SchNEWS).

PEPPERED

Over in the states, Kathy Kelly was arrested at a demonstration against the Western Hemisphere Institute for Security Cooperation after trespassing at their US military training camp. The Institute has been a target of protestors for years because it teaches Latin American soldiers all about the Western values of counter-insurgency. The Public Relations spokespeople for the Institute claims that the school has been reformed and now teaches these soldiers the same standards of respect for human rights and civil law practiced by the US military. Which is why once Kathy was arrested, she was pushed to the floor, handcuffed, kneed while begging for relief because she couldn't breathe, dragged and

threatened with pepper spray if she didn't cooperate when being fingerprinted.

Meanwhile in Iraq, top military commander General Ricardo Sanchez has been busy with his new get-tough strategy with tactics borrowed from Israel, who we can often see on the TV practicing their own kind of 'freedom' on Palestinians. After the Yanks got fed up with attacks from the village of Abu Hishma, a 500-bomb was dropped on one house while eight sheiks, the mayor, the police chief and most members of the city council have been arrested. Razor wire fencing now stretches for five miles around the whole village. "This fence is here for your protection," reads the sign "Do not approach or try to cross, or you will be shot." All men aged 18 to 65 have been ordered to get identification cards. One Colonel said "With a heavy dose of fear and violence, and a lot of money for projects, I think we can convince these people that we are here to help them.'

One of the reasons given for invading Iraq was to get rid of the brutal tyrant Saddam Hussein (and let's forget that it was the moral West who supported and armed him in the first place!). So what about other brutal tyrants? Well in Uzbekistan there are over 6,000 political and religious prisoners, and every year some of them can look forward to being tortured to death. Sometimes they have their ribs and then their skulls broken with hammers or have bits of skin ripped off with pliers. Some have been left to stand up to their knees for a fortnight in freezing water; others have been boiled to death. But Uzbekistan, in the middle of central Asia's massive gas and oil fields and is seen by the US government as a key western asset. Last year, the country received \$500 million in aid, of which \$79 million went to the police and intelligence services, who are responsible for most of the torture. Meanwhile at the beginning of the year Tony 'democracy not dictatorship' Blair, gave Uzbekistan the green light to import whatever weapons it wanted from us.

Then there's Guantanamo Bay where for the past two years 600 people have been held in small cages without trial. They eventually face a closed military tribunal, with prosecution, defence and judge all appointed by the US military. Or Belmarsh Prison, where 16 people are being held indefinitely without charge under our Terrorism laws. These are some of the shining examples of Freedom and Democracy that we are holding up as an example to dictatorships across the world.

CRAP ARREST OF THE WEEK For buying a lemonade!

A fire fighter from Minnesota was on holiday in Miami at the same time as the Free Trade Area of the Americas summit, where the authorities were busy beating the human rights out of anyone they thought might be an anarchist (see SchNEWS 432). The fireman decided to stop and buy a lemonade on the way back to his hotel but after leaving the store he found his way blocked by a police line where upon he asked them which way to go to his car. He was then nicked, held for 48 hours and then taken to court where the prosecution realised that actually he was a fire fighter, was nothing to do with the demo and dropped all the charges.

ASSAULTED

One thing both Britain and America like is handing out weapons around the world. Only the other day Amnesty International published 'The Pain Merchants' a report that showed that last year the Bush administration approved the export of electro-shock weapons valued at \$14.7 million and restraints worth \$4.4 million. 45 countries bought the stuff, including 19 that have been cited for the use of such weapons to torture prisoners. Take Turkey for example: in one case a 17-year-old schoolgirl who had been detained for distributing leaflets calling for Kurdish education was stripped, threatened with rape and tortured with electric shocks to her feet, legs and stomach.

Every minute of every day someone is killed by conventional arms. So International Human Rights Day this year was the day a number of countries pledged their support for an international Arms Trade Treaty. Unfortunately it wasn't the world's biggest arms exporters, but the political leaders of Brazil, Cambodia, Mali, Macedonia, Costa Rica. Finland and the Netherlands that made the announcement. It will be interesting to see if any of the five permanent members of the UN Security Council - the largest producers and traders in weapons rush over and put their name to such a treaty. SchNEWS warns readers not to hold their breath

Talk about double standards: Before the Stop Bush demo, teachers, headmasters and police were all on telly saying kids would be suspended or expelled for going on the march. Then last Monday for the rugby world cup parade a senior cop said "Truanting children are not my priority." and before the big demo against George W there were scare stories about how Al Qaeda would use the demo as cover for terrorism, but no such warnings for the rugby victory parade.

Also here at SchNEWS towers we're quite used to the cops and media getting it wrong on the "How many were there?" question but normally they say it's well under the actual figure that attended. This time, surprise surprise, it was miles over with the media saying there were 750,000 people there. Maybe the person counting was pissed and seeing double!

WAR ON ERROR

This week a group of former terror suspects had charges against them dropped - predictably there was no big fanfare from the media that the justice system had messed up. Nine Algerian men were arrested last December. They were kept in jail for four months without charge, released on bail in March and finally had their charges dropped on Tuesday.

Rosemary McIlwhan, director of the Scottish Human Rights Centre said: "It is interesting to see that the arrest of these people was trumpeted and fanfared whereas when they were released it was very quiet, and now we have had the charges dropped with next to no comment at all. It raises the issue that the government is stirring up hysteria about terrorism that is not really there.

Three of the men arrested have complained that the terrorism allegations are still hanging over them. Hakim Ziem, 32, said: "We cannot go back to our country to see our families, we cannot go to work because everyone knows our names, we cannot do anything, our lives have been destroyed." The men want an official declaration of their innocence after claiming they would face death squads if they return to Algeria. They are also demanding answers regarding their detention, which they said had implications for other people arrested under terrorism laws since the World Trade Centre attacks. Perhaps the police should investigate first and then arrest people... or realize that not all criminals are Irish, black or Islamic. In fact police figures show that while Irish and Black communities are arrested more they have lower crime and drug use rates.

In contravention of international law, anti-terrorist legislation allows persecution of ethnic minorities. The government treats foreigners accused of crimes as automatically guilty, following the lead of human rights law specialists - the US government, who have similar legislation, allowing any non citizen to be locked up indefinitely for any 'violation' (which is not a guilty verdict).

Meanwhile the case against the six people who were arrested and charged under anti-terror legislation in December last year for supporting the struggle for democracy in Turkey continued at Kingston Crown Court last Friday. The Justice system hit a new low as the men face charges of "facilitating the retention or control of terrorist property" which turned out to be magazines, films and posters in support of a Turkish political party critical of the Turkish government. These 'terrorist' magazines are actually legal in "liberal" Turkey... (see SchNEWS 392)

Within the last week there have been numerous arrests under the Terrorism Act and again they follow the same pattern. Politicians confirm live on television the guilt of those arrested, details of those detained splashed all over the papers and follow up arrests leading to more detentions. No quick or fair process is guaranteed for those that find themselves on the receiving end of these operations. Almost a year later and the six are still being held for having a few magazines.

...and finally... Fed up wtih Christmas already? Well you're

not the only one. Shop workers in Germany and Holland have vowed to go on strike if they have to endure anymore Christmas carols, which are played in a continuous loop all the time they are at work. Spokesman Gottfried Rieser said "Unlike the clients, the shop workers can't escape this Christmas muzak which is boosting through the loudspeakers all day long. It arouses aggressive feelings and they are getting an aversion to all carols. They feel as if they are terrorized. Especially Jingle Bells which is the worst.' We couldn't agree more! Bah Humbug!
