

PARLIA-MENT-AL ...A-TO-B PEACE MARCH BANNED AS UK JUNTA CRACKS DOWN IN SHOW OF SOLIDARITY WITH BURMESE GOVERNMENT

"This is rather a ham-fisted attempt to prevent us from demonstrating. What they (the government and police) do is up to them. We will just ignore them and we have the moral and logical high-ground. I will be marching on Monday 8 October." - Mark Thomas

Police forbid a march on the centre of government – Rangoon? Nope, London. While Gordon Brown reminds the world of our commitment to human rights and expresses his disgust at the treatment meted out to Burmese protestors, its a different story when it come to the overwrought mother of parliaments.

The previously studiously uncontroversial **Stop the War Coalition** has run up against the big protest clampdown. Their planned "Troops Out" march on October 8th from Trafalgar square to Parliament has been banned by the Met police. But they're planning to march anyway.

Usually STWC conducts totally legal demonstrations and has not previously lent its support to illegal direct action. On this occasion they were in negotiation with the police for some weeks beforehand and by cunningly apparently getting round the Public Order and SOCPA legislation by fully complying with it, the march appeared to have the police go ahead. Their marches, which tend to be of the 'go from a set A to B, hear Tony Benn' affairs, have been sanctioned and facilitated before by the police - in a marked contrast to heavy handed treatment of unauthorised events such as Sack Parliament (see SchNEWS 564). Pundits used to the Met's usual attitude to protests were left slack-jawed at the minimal policing in evidence on the massive march in Feb 2003. In fact discussions between the organisers and the police included plans to neutralise anarchist elements, such as samba group Rhythms of Resistance.

However, last Friday in a room at New Scotland Yard, in a meeting with events coordinator Inspector Stuart Cornish – claiming to be acting on a "steer from upstairs", he informed them that the march would not be allowed within one mile of parliament. In return the organisers were offered a static demo – and to their credit they walked out of the meeting.

BACK TO THE FUTURE To achieve this the cops dusted off the the

10 achieve this the cops dusted off the the 1839 Sessional Orders legislation, which allows the granting of orders to allow the free passage of MPs and peers into Parliament.



The Act "ORDERED, That the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis do take care that the passages through the streets leading to this House be kept free and open and that no obstruction be permitted to hinder the passage of Members to and from this House". When this act was passed the greatest threat to the state was Chartism, a riotous movement demanding democratic freedom. What next? Public gatherings broken up under the 'Corn Laws'? The return of the ducking stool?

The Sessional orders do not actually confer any extra powers on the police, being merely a formal expression of parliament's wishes. Those wishes being of course being that the people should in no way attempt to interfere with the business of their masters. But it is anticipated that police will make arrests under the usual Do What You're Told Act if any attempt is made to breach the cordon around parliament.

OVER 1000 ARRESTS AT FASLANE365 The Faslane naval base holds nuclear-armed Trident submarines, and since 1982 has had nuisance neighbours in the form of the Faslane peace camp. This Monday was the Big Blockade send-off for the year-long Faslane365 action and it went with a bang. After over 100 separate actions during the year by anti-war groups coming from all around the country and beyond, SchNEWS was wondering whether the total arrests would hit the 1000 mark on the last day, and we weren't disappointed. During the year we began a Faslane365in365o-meter, to track whether there was going to be 365 arrests in the year - with a prize to the 365th arrestee, which happened only three months into the campaign. (For the record we did actually meet him and he graciously refused any prize - we'll never get rid of some of those old books!) So even we were obviously out of touch with current police peace protest arrest-rates.

On the day of action around a thousand people from across the UK and Europe descended on the main gates of the base. By 7am, the Northern gate was blockaded with protesters chaining bits of their bodies to the gates and others super-gluing themselves together and pouring paint over themselves (just to impede police). By 8.30am, the South gates were blocked preventing all road access to the base. By mid-morning the police response had kicked in with around 100 arrests. and at the day's end they tallied an impressive 180. There was also a roadblock including at tripod on the A814 to Garelochhead, leading to The Royal Naval Armament Depot (RNAD) at Coulport, Loch Long - where Trident nuclear missiles are stored. For those not arrested during the morning, the day continued at the North gate in a noisy fashion with all the usual demo theatrics like clowns, and live music powered by Rinky Dink. It ended at 3.30 with a closing ceremony.

With the Faslane365 arrests figure hovering around the 970 mark, by mid-morning the 1000 barrier was smashed, leading to a total of 1150 arrests during the year. Notching up an impressive average of over three arrests every single day for a whole year, it is claimed that the police bill for Faslane 365 has been over £5 million. A drop in the ocean next to Trident of course...

When this was predictably refused, they went away to get a warrant to search the farm for drugs. Given two hours warning the two hundred campers were ready and greeted the cops with video cameras. They even set out benches in a semi-circle so that onlookers could enjoy the farce in comfort. Needless to say the assembled plod walked away empty-handed.

DICED SHAM

Activists arrested at the DSEi arms fair for trying to get into the exhibition hall (see SchNEWS 602) have already their charges dropped. Around fifteen protestors were arrested, most were released without charge on the day. The remainder were charged with 'tresspass with intent of disrupting lawful activity' and were gearing themselves up for a political court case where they could argue that DSEi's activities were illegal. (Co-incidentally shortly after the arrests a number companies exhibiting more legally dubious hardware were asked to leave the exhibition). It's no coincidence then that the London CPS deicided not to press ahead with such a potentially embarrassing court case.

TOTAL SWINES

Despite reports that head of the military junta, General Than Shwe has agreed in principle to meet the pro-democracy NLD party leader Aung San Suu Kvi, the regime's vicious backlash to the protests in Burma (See SchNEWS 604) continued this week, with state snatch squads raiding all over Rangoon. One account has ten thousand rounded up for interrogation and many thousands are reported as 'disappeared'-killed, detained for torture or destined for remote prisons. Many have tried to flee the city, as military vehicles were sent onto the streets complete with loudspeakers blaring: "We have photographs. We are going to make arrests.'

BANGERS & SMASH

After their action camp (See SchNEWS 601) SMASH EDO activists were back to their usual tricks. In the early hours of October 3rd, eight activists entered the grounds of bombbuilders EDO MBM, angered by the continued local presence of a company supplying parts for the war machines in Iraq and Palestine and Afghanistan to mention but three.

Activists scaled the fence at the crack of dawn and quickly managed to superglue all six entrances to the factory, making it impossible for employees to enter, shutting EDO down. Two campaigners locked on to the two main doors at the front of the building. True to form, there were a series of confrontations between the protesters and the onsite security goon. He attempted to chase those not locked-on out of the car park by driving at them in his car, pinning one against the metal fence. Guardian Guards seem notorious for placing aggressive thugs at EDO MBM, and this clown proved no exception. In the time it took for the police to show up he had assaulted and racially abused three of the protesters.

It didn't take too long for the police to show up but were slowed down by an unexpected inconvenient barricade which appeared at the bottom of Home Farm Road. When they did eventually make it through to the factory, they began arresting activists, leaving just one locked to the entrance. But not before a baffled Paul Hills, the managing director, had felt he had no other option but to break into his own factory by smashing a window! After the fire brigade refused to attend the incident, police managed to unlock the last activist at 8.30am.

Cops then began to confiscate cameras, claiming that they needed the footage for evidence of criminal activities. When one cameraman struggled to hold onto his property he was also collared, taking the arrest count up to five. All re now bailed with charges pending.

Activists were informed at Hollingbury nick that EDO MBM had lost a lot through this ordeal, having to replace all locks on all entrances, a pane of glass for the window, and generally making losses as employees were unable to continue with their day's important work.
